

Can't pay your full rent, mortgage or utilities due to COVID-19 loss of income?



You may be eligible to receive emergency housing assistance.

- ▶ First, determine your eligibility for the state's program. If eligible, you can apply online for benefits.

The **COVID-19 Iowa Eviction and Foreclosure Prevention Program** provides short term relief, up to \$3,200 for rent and \$3,600 for mortgage payments, to income eligible renters and homeowners who are at risk of eviction or foreclosure. You must apply online at www.iowafinance.com/covid-19-iowa-eviction-and-foreclosure-prevention-program.

- ▶ If you are **not** eligible for the state's program, and you live in Iowa City, contact **CommUnity Crisis Services and Food Bank** at **319-519-6183** and ask to apply for Iowa City's CDBG funds for eviction and foreclosure prevention. Those ineligible for the state's assistance may be able to receive up to six month's assistance for rent, mortgage, and/or utilities that are late or unpaid, up to \$4,800.
